1.0 Summary

1.1 To agree the Appointments for 2016/17

2.0 Background

2.1 The business conducted at the Annual Meeting of Council is governed by the Local Government Act 1972, the Local Government and Housing Act 1989, the Local Government Act 2000 and Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act, 2007 where this relates to executive arrangements.

2.2 The Procedure Rules for the Annual Meeting of Council are set out in Part 4 of the Council's Constitution.

2.3 Appointments to the Executive are made by the Leader and notified to the Proper Officer.

3.0 Proposals

3.1 That the Council confirm the items relating to the appointments as set out in Annex A to this report which will be circulated prior to the meeting when the details have been received from each of the Political Groups on the Council.

3.2 That the Council appoints a Leader of the Main Opposition as the criteria for this position as set out in the Constitution is met namely:

39.0 (b) Where there is a political group or combination of political groups forming the administration, the Leader of the Main Opposition shall be the leader of the next largest political group

- 3.3 That the appointment of the Council's representative to the West Sussex Health and Adult Social Care Select Committee be made from the membership of the Council's Overview and Scrutiny committee.

4.0 Legal

- 4.1 s106 Local Government Act 1972 provides that councils may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business
- 4.2 s111 Local Government Act 1972 provides that the Council shall have the power to do anything which is calculated to facilitate or is conducive or incidental to the discharge of any of their functions.
- 4.3 s15, 16 and 17 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 set out powers and duties in relation to political balance on Committees and the exceptions and exemptions therein.
- 4.4 Local Government Act 2000 as amended by the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 sets out regulations regarding appointments to Cabinet and Committees in Councils that have adopted Executive arrangements.
- 4.5 The Local Choice Functions are listed in the Constitution at Part 3 Section 3.

5.0 Financial implications

6.0 Recommendation
