Extract from the Joint Strategic Committee - 6 December 2016

JSC/070/16-17 *"Platforms for our Places"* - Unlocking the power of people, communities and our local geographies

Before the Committee was a joint report by the Chief Executive, copies of which had been circulated to all Members and a copy of which is attached to the signed copy of these Minutes as Item 6.

The report informed the Committee that the idea behind *Platforms for our Places* (Appendix 1) was evolutionary, not revolutionary from *Surf's Up*. Drawing on the themes of *Surf's Up* the Councils recognised they could not and should not seek to do everything for everyone.

Their role had been focussed on provision of essential services and the creation of the required "platforms" upon which others in the communities of Adur and Worthing were able to do the things, which would create and sustain long term prosperity.

The document identifies 5 key platforms namely:-

- Our Financial Economies
- Our Social Economies
- Stewarding our Natural Resources
- Services and Solutions for our places
- Leadership of our Places

Underpinning each of the platforms were a series of commitments for both Councils (and a range of stakeholders) to create, sustain and further develop the platforms. They were serious statements of intent which were ambitious and accompanied by realistic timescales for implementation.

Members noted that *Platforms for our Places* had been developed in parallel with the 2017/18 budgets and that officers would bring an update report to the Joint Strategic Committee on a 6 monthly basis with an annual look at what had gone well and what had not.

A Member asked whether *Platforms for our Places* had been shared with our partners. Officers advised that the position of partners on a range of issues and what they were interested in doing was known and that a series of conversations would take place during January and February 2017.

A Member suggested that the timescale given for project 2.2.4 under commitment 2.2 was not specific enough. Officers agreed to review the timescale and identify a month for the delivery of a plan.

The Committee expressed their support for *Platforms for our Places* which prepared both Councils for the big financial challenges ahead whilst maintaining their ambitions.

Decision

That the Joint Strategic Committee considered the draft *Platforms for our Places* approach and recommended that:-

- 1. Adur District Council consider the draft *Platforms for our Places* document and endorse the approach as one of Adur District Council's strategic documents for the next 3 years;
- 2. Worthing Borough Council consider the draft *Platforms for our Places* document and endorse the approach as one of Worthing Borough Council's strategic documents for the next 3 years;
- 3. That if (1) and (2) above are agreed, that officers be instructed to:-
 - design the document and means of communicating it in a low cost and digitally friendly manner
 - to begin the key conversations with strategic partners
 - to put in place the suggested oversight arrangements

Extract from the Joint Strategic Committee - 6 December 2016

JSC/072/16-17 Capital Investment Programme 2017/18 - 2019/20 Adur District Council, Worthing Borough Council and Joint Committee

Before the Committee was a report by the Director for Digital & Resources, copies of which had been circulated to all Members and a copy of which is attached to the signed copy of these Minutes as Item 8.

The report recommended the schemes for inclusion in the overall Capital Investment Programme for the three years 2017/2018 - 2019/2020 for Adur District Council, Worthing Borough Council and the Joint Strategic Committee.

The report informed the Joint Strategic Committee of the resources available for future capital investment, and updated Members about the financing of the proposed three-year programmes.

Officers outlined some of the work being undertaken as part of the Capital Investment programme including, good progress in the delivery of the Kitchen & Bathrooms programme in Adur Homes properties; the refurbishment of Colonnade House and creation of new artist studio space which was proving to be a great success; the play area at the Gallops; Homefield skatepark and the car park extension at the crematorium.

The prioritised programme of work was very extensive and the details of which were included as appendices to the report.

It was proposed and seconded that Bid 25, 'Town Centres and Street Scene - Improvements to the visual quality of the town centres and street scene in Adur District' replace Bid 20, 'Shoreham Centre - Provision of a DDA changing places facility' in the bids submitted for the Adur Capital Investment Programme 2017/18 - 2019/20.

Decision.

The Joint Strategic Committee:-

- (i) approved increasing the Worthing Borough Council programme by £0.85m to provide for the Environmental Improvements to Brooklands Lake;
- (ii) approved increasing the Adur District programme by £84,000 for the installation of new stand pipes;
- (iii) considered the three General Fund Capital Investment Programmes for the three-year period 2017/18 to 2019/2020 and confirmed the schemes to be included as detailed in Appendix 2, 3 and 4, as amended by decisions (a) and (b) above and to replace bid 20 with bid 25 in the Adur Capital Investment Programme 2017/18 - 2019/20;
- (iv) agreed the Adur Housing Renovation Programme for the three-year period 2017/18 to 2019/2020 as detailed at Appendix 5;
- (v) agreed the amendments and additions to the reserve lists as detailed in Appendices 6 and 7;
- (vi) recommended the 3 Year Programmes for approval by the respective Councils on the 20th December 2016 (Adur) and 15th December 2016 (Worthing).

JSC/049/16-17 Gigabit West Sussex - an ultrafast broadband model for the County

Decision

That the Joint Strategic Committee:-

- 1. re-affirmed its "Surf's Up" strategic aim to bring ultrafast (gigabit) connectivity to Adur & Worthing and extends this support to other towns in West Sussex, for the benefit of businesses and the public sector, and ultimately homes;
- 2. recommended the project to the West Sussex Chief Executive's Forum and supported the presentation of a business case for project funding, to the benefit of all districts and boroughs in the county;
- agreed that Adur & Worthing be the first "call off" from the framework, and that the Councils' sites be included in procurement alongside WSCC sites, accepting the principle of securing a long term right to use of up to 20 years for a capital sum, whose revenue cost can be accommodated within the forecasted revenue budget envelope;
- 4. acknowledged that should additional funds be needed, whether because the market demanded it for the provision of gigabit services, or there was a broader investment opportunity available attracting gainshare, that a subsequent report would be presented making the case for investment.

Motion on Notice

'Count them in' - Making the next census count for our Armed Forces community

The 'Count Them In' campaign launched by the Royal British Legion in May 2016, highlights the lack of gathered knowledge on members of our armed forces, their communities, where they live and their needs to support and deliver the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant.

The 'Count them in' campaign calls on the UK, Scottish and Northern Irish governments to include a new topic in the 2021 census that concerns military service and membership of the Armed Forces community. The Legion maintains that the 2021 census provides a unique opportunity for the nation to produce a comprehensive snapshot of its Armed Forces population, ensuring that resources and policies can be evidence-based and reach those who most need our support.

Locally capturing this data will enable better understanding of the population in Adur and Worthing, specifically Regular and Reservist Serving personnel, veterans and their families leading to more focused support the Armed Forces community in line with the principles each Council has signed up to in the Armed Forces Covenant.

The Council calls upon the UK Parliament to include in the final census questionnaire questions concerning our Armed Forces community.
