Adur Competitive Community Grants Budget 2013/14 Extension to Round 3.

Report by the Executive Head of Planning, Regeneration & Wellbeing

1.0 Summary

1.1 This report requests the Cabinet Member to consider the allocation of an addition to the grant application received from Southlanders from the 2013/14 grants budget.

2.0 Background

- 2.1 There is no legal obligation on the Council to provide financial or other assistance to voluntary and community groups. However, the Council recognises the vital part played by such groups in the life of the District e.g. in the Councils' corporate priorities 2011-14: 'Develop ways in which the Councils can commission the Community and Voluntary sector to deliver services'.
- 2.2 The Council currently provides grants to voluntary groups in two ways: through ongoing contracts and Service and Funding Agreements with a number of key providers, and through a small grants programme which is subject to application 3 times per year.
- 2.3 The Council also supports voluntary groups through the granting of discretionary rate relief and subsidised rents. However, the recommendations in this report do not apply to these forms of support.

3.0 Proposal

- 3.1 Southlanders is a community-based organisation providing support, meals and social opportunities for older and more vulnerable people within one of our areas of deprivation. They have recently received money from Adur Community Grants for a refrigerator to store food used for the lunch club for older people and had been expecting funding from other sources towards the purchase of a new cooker. Sadly this funding has not been forthcoming, putting the lunch club at risk.
- 3.2 The Cabinet Member has received a request to grant an additional £675 towards the cost of the cooker in order that the lunch club and other local arrangements can continue.

4.0 Legal

4.1 Section 2 of the Local Government Act, 2000 allows a Council to do anything which they consider is likely to achieve the promotion or improvement of the economic, social or environmental well-being of its area. This includes the giving of grants.

5.0 Financial implications

5.1 There will be approximately **£20,000** left in the 2013/14 grants budget if this grant is agreed.

6.0 Recommendation

- 6.1 It is recommended that the Cabinet Member
 - i) Makes a decision concerning the allocation of the additional funding from the 2013/14 Adur Community Grants budget.
