Interview with the Chairman of the West Sussex Health and Adult Social Care Select Committee

Report by the Director for Digital and Resources

Executive Summary

1. Purpose

1.1 This report provides the Committee with information on the West Sussex Health and Adult Social Care Select Committee (HASC) to provide context to assist it in the interview with and presentation from the Chairman of the HASC, Councillor Bryan Turner of West Sussex County Council.

2. Recommendations

2.1 That the Joint Overview and Scrutiny Committee (JOSC) is asked to review and question the Chairman of the West Sussex HASC on its work.

3. Context

- 3.1 As part of the current Work Programme for 2018/19, JOSC have agreed to interview and receive a presentation from the Chairman of the West Sussex HASC to find out more about the work of the Select Committee and to assess how it can achieve better links between it and JOSC, perhaps by utilising the two appointed representatives from the Councils more effectively.
- 3.2 JOSC will receive a presentation from the Chairman of the HASC and then will have the opportunity to question him.

4. Issues for consideration

- 4.1 JOSC is entitled to ask for further investigation into items in relation to Health Scrutiny that they may not be satisfied with which should be via the appointed representative to the HASC. It is important to note that the role of health Scrutiny sits with the HASC.
- 4.2 The HASC is responsible for scrutinising the following issues across West Sussex::-

Adult social care services Adults' safeguarding Coroner's services Dementia services Health and health partnerships Public Health The review and scrutiny of the planning, provision and operation of health services in West Sussex.

- 4.3 HASC has 20 members made up of 12 County Councillors, seven District and Borough Councillors (from Overview and Scrutiny Committees across West Sussex) and one Local Healthwatch member (non-voting). Councillors Kevin Boram (Adur) and Keith Bickers (Worthing) represent JOSC on the HASC.
- 4.4 The primary aim of health scrutiny is to strengthen the voice of local people, ensuring that their needs and experiences are considered as an integral part of the commissioning and delivery of health services and that those services are effective and safe. Health scrutiny has a strategic role in taking an overview of how well integration of health, public health and social care is working.

5. Engagement and Communication

5.1 The JOSC Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen and relevant Officers have been consulted on the proposals contained in this report.

Executive Summary

1. Purpose

1.1 This report provides the Committee with information on the Adur and Worthing Safer Communities Partnership in order that the Committee can scrutinise the work of the Partnership and interview the Chairman of the Partnership, Councillor David Simmons.

3. Context

- 3.1 As part of the Work Programme for 2018/19, JOSC have agreed to interview the Chairman of the Adur and Worthing Safer Communities Partnership (A&WSCP).
- 3.2 The Committee will receive a presentation from Councillor David Simmons and then will have the opportunity to question him.

4. Issues for consideration

- 4.1 As part of its crime and disorder scrutiny role, JOSC are asked to consider the role of the A&WSCP. The Committee are entitled to ask for further investigation into items where they may not be satisfied with the progress. The Committee also has the responsibility under the Police and Justice Act 2006 to scrutinise crime and disorder and the work of the A&WSCP.
- 4.2 The Adur & Worthing Safer Communities Partnership vision is to reduce crime and disorder through effective multi-agency working to make Adur and Worthing a safer place to live, work and visit. Safer Communities is also about how safe people feel in their own communities and how it is possible to make a real difference by working together to help cut crime and its causes and the fear of crime.
- 4.3 The A&WSCP has a statutory duty to reduce crime and disorder. The Partnership includes representatives from a range of agencies:-
 - Adur & Worthing Councils
 - Sussex Police
 - Sussex Police Authority
 - West Sussex County Council
 - West Sussex Fire & Rescue Service
 - NHS West Sussex
 - Sussex Probation

Other partners contribute to the work including organisations from the Community Partnership, the voluntary sector, local businesses and members of the community.
