## Decision making by Worthing Borough Council in 2019/20

Joint Report by the Director for Communities and the Solicitor to the Council

## Executive Summary

1. Purpose
1.1. To note the election of Councillor Richard Nowak representing the Conservative Party for Salvington Ward.
1.2. To note the re-calculation of the political balance resulting from the by-election.
1.3. To note a change in the nomination of the Conservative Group's membership of the Joint Overview \& Scrutiny Committee and to make the appointment as necessary.
2. Recommendations
2.1. That the Council notes the revised political balance of the Council as per paragraph 3.4.
2.2. That the Council confirms the political groups, the number and proportion of seats as set out in Appendix A to this report.
2.3. That the Council appoints to the Committees in accordance with the wishes of the Political Groups on the Council detailed in Appendix B.

## 3. Context

3.1. At the meeting of Annual Council in May 2019 Council determined a number of matters related to decision making by the Council until May 2020.
3.2. Following a by-election in Salvington Ward on the 12 December 2019, it has been necessary for Officers to recalculate the political balance of Worthing Borough Council, the details of which are outlined in paragraph 3.4 of the report below.
3.3. Decision making is governed by the Local Government Act 1972, the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 and the Local Government Act 2000 and Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 where this relates to Executive arrangements.
3.4. The new calculation of the political balance of the Authority is:

Number of seats on Council:

| 23 | Conservative | $62.16 \%$ |

| 10 | Labour | $27.00 \%$ |
| 3 | Liberal Democrats | $8.11 \%$ |
| 1 | UKIP | $2.70 \%$ |

3.5. In summary, 2 or more elected members may give notice to the Proper Officer that they have formed a group on the Council. Seats on committees are allocated in proportion to the political balance of the Council. The largest Group may not hold all the seats on a committee, Groups can give up seats and, as far as possible, entitlements should not be exceeded. Any seats not allocated 'as of right' may be offered to other elected members on a council where they do not form a Group.

## 4. Issues for consideration

4.1. The Council notes the Political Balance of the Council following the Salvington Ward by-election held on 12 December 2019 as detailed at Appendix A.
4.2. Council must agree the non-executive committee memberships. These are outlined in Appendix B.

5.1. Group Leaders have been consulted regarding their proposed nominations to the various seats in the decision making structure.

## In summary:

The Conservative group allocation is correct according to the political balance rules on a committee by committee basis. However, this results in the Conservative group being under allocated by 1 seat in respect of its overall rounded allocation of seats by committee.

The Liberal Democrats group allocation is correct according to the political balance rules on a committee by committee basis. Council to note that this results in the Liberal Democrats group being fully allocated.

The Labour group allocation is correct according to the political balance rules on a committee by committee basis. However, this results in the Labour group being under allocated by 1 seat in respect of its overall rounded allocation of seats by committee.

There remains 2 seats unallocated, one on the Licensing \& Control Committee and one on the Overview \& Scrutiny Committee. One of these seats should be taken by the Conservative Group and the other seat should be taken by the Labour Group.
